RE: College of Dental Surgeons; Prosecution of Kristofer Kurc

Further to the decision in this matter, I am able to advise that on Thursday, July 6, 2006, at Lloydminster, Saskatchewan, His Honour L.P. Deshaye sentenced Mr. Kristofer Kurc to the following:

1. On Count #1 – Unauthorized Procedures Performed on Ashley Heck; fine of \$2,800.00 and in default 46 days in jail; and
2. On Count #2 – Patti Dawson; fine of \$2,300.00 and in default 38 days in jail.

Mr. Kurc has until November 1, 2006 to pay the fines.

In passing sentence the Learned Judge commented that the Defendant should receive a fine which would carry with it a deterrence not only to the Defendant but to others who might be encouraged to perform similar procedures. He commented that the fine should be substantial and carry a sting to it.

In this case the Judge was impressed that Mr. Kurc did not notify Ashley Heck of the risk associated with the procedure he performed on her. He should have discussed the risk with her and had she known all the facts might not have accepted that he perform the extractions. Because the risk was not as extreme for Patti Dawson, the Judge assessed a higher fine for Count #1.

In his final comments the Judge stated that the sentence required an appropriate sanction and that the sentence should reflect a penalty to Mr. Kurc for his conduct.

The Judge determined that he was without jurisdiction to order that Mr. Kurc pay restitution to each of Ashley Heck and Patti Dawson. However if this matter is brought before a Discipline Committee of the Saskatchewan Dental Therapists Association and if Mr. Kurc is found guilty of unprofessional conduct then an order for restitution could be made.


